

**LOUISIANA STATE BAR ASSOCIATION**  
**ELECTION PROCEDURES**  
**2009/2010**

RESOLVED, that pursuant to the authority vested by Section 2, Article VII of the Articles of Incorporation, the Board of Governors hereby adopts the following procedures for the Association's 2009/2010 elections, in accordance with the Association's Articles of Incorporation and, where applicable, the provisions of Title 18, Louisiana Election Code. The election schedule is attached as an addendum to these procedures.

**Section 1.** The Secretary of the Association shall notify each active member of the Association not later than September 21, 2009, that he/she is ready to receive qualifying notices of candidates for positions as set forth below:

- a. **Board of Governors** – One member to be elected by and from each of the First, Fourth and Fifth Board of Governors Districts, for three-year terms beginning at the adjournment of the 2010 LSBA Annual Meeting and ending at the adjournment of the 2013 LSBA Annual Meeting.
- b. **House of Delegates** – One delegate to be elected by and from each of the First through Nineteenth Judicial Districts, plus one additional delegate for every additional district judge in each district, for two-year terms beginning at the commencement of the 2010 LSBA Annual Meeting and ending at the commencement of the 2012 LSBA Annual Meeting.
- c. **Nominating Committee** – A total of 15 members for terms of one-year each to be elected by and from the following districts: District 1A (Parish of Orleans), four (4) members; District 1B (Parishes of Plaquemines, St. Bernard and St. Tammany, one (1) member; District 2A (Parish of East Baton Rouge), two (2) members; District 2B (Parish of Jefferson), two (2) members; District 2C (Parishes of Ascension, Assumption, East Feliciana, Iberville, Lafourche, Livingston, Point Coupee, St. Charles, St. Helena, St. James, St. John the Baptist, Tangipahoa, Terrebonne, Washington, West Baton Rouge and West Feliciana), one (1) member; District 3A (Parish of Lafayette), one (1) member; District 3B (Parishes of Acadia, Beauregard, Calcasieu, Cameron, Iberia, Jefferson Davis, St. Martin, St. Mary and Vermilion), one (1) member; District 3C (Parishes of Allen, Avoyelles, Evangeline, Grant, LaSalle, Natchitoches, Rapides, Sabine, St. Landry and Vernon), one (1) member; District 3D

(Parishes of Bossier and Caddo), one (1) member; and District 3E (Parishes of Bienville, Caldwell, Catahoula, Claiborne, Concordia, DeSoto, East Carroll, Franklin, Jackson, Lincoln, Madison, Morehouse, Ouachita, Red River, Richland, Tensas, Union, Webster, West Carroll and Winn), one (1) member. Terms shall begin at the adjournment of the 2010 LSBA Annual Meeting and end at the adjournment of the 2011 LSBA Annual Meeting.

- d. **American Bar Association House of Delegates** – Two (2) delegates from the membership at large and one (1) delegate from that portion of the membership not having reached their 35<sup>th</sup> birthday by August 10, 2010, that delegate being the “Young Lawyer Delegate,” all as required by the rules of the American Bar Association. All LSBA members may vote for both sets of candidates. The delegates shall serve terms of two years, beginning with the adjournment of the 2010 Annual Meeting of the American Bar Association and expiring at the adjournment of the 2012 Annual Meeting of the American Bar Association, all as provided in Paragraph 6.4(e) of the ABA Constitution.

**Section 2.** Any member eligible to hold a position or positions as set forth above may qualify by giving written notice to the LSBA Secretary not later than October 19, 2009. A member may nominate another member provided that he/she has obtained the nominated member's permission.

- a. No member of this Association shall be a candidate for or hold more than one office in this Association at any one time. The term "office" shall include President, President-Elect, Secretary, Treasurer, members of the Board of Governors, and members of the House of Delegates. The term "office" shall *not* include members of the Nominating Committee, members of the ABA House of Delegates or officers in any LSBA section.
- b. For purposes of voting and/or qualifying for office, the preferred mailing address of the member, as carried in the Association's membership database, shall control.

**Section 3.** Elections shall be held in each instance where more candidates qualify than there are available positions. In such cases, the LSBA Secretary shall, not later than November 16, 2009, cause to be made available to each eligible active and faculty member ballot(s) which shall be composed, distributed, returned and tabulated in the manner provided for in Article VI of the LSBA

Articles of Incorporation, provided that such ballots shall be received not later than December 14, 2009. Ballots subsequently received shall not be counted.

Candidates shall be listed on the ballots in alphabetical order, with the position, number to be elected and the terms of office plainly set forth.

**Section 4.** After the ballots have been tabulated, a second election shall be held in each instance where any candidate has failed to receive a majority of the votes cast for the office for which he/she was a candidate. In such cases, the Secretary of the Association shall, not later than January 11, 2010, cause to be made available to each eligible active and faculty member ballot(s) which shall be composed, distributed, returned and tabulated as hereinabove provided for the first election. All ballots in the second election shall be received not later than February 8, 2010; ballots subsequently received shall not be counted.

Candidates shall be listed on the ballots in alphabetical order, with the position, number to be elected and the terms of office plainly set forth.

**Section 5.** After the elections, results shall be transmitted as set forth in Article IX of the Articles of Incorporation.
