***Emergency Rule Change Concerning Suspension of  
Continuing Legal Education Requirement for 2005***


Acting in accordance with Article V, Sections 1 and 5 of the Louisiana Constitution, and the inherent power of this Court, and considering the hardships imposed on Louisiana-licensed lawyers by Hurricane Katrina,

**It is hereby ordered, adjudged, and decreed that:**

Effective for Calendar Year 2005 only, attorneys who are subject to the Rules for Continuing Legal Education, Rule XXX of the Rules of this Court, shall not be required to complete the annual minimum legal education requirement of twelve and one half (12.5) hours.

The minimum annual legal education requirement of twelve and one half (12.5) hours, which is codified in Rule XXX, Rule 3(a) and Regulation 3.1 of the Rules of this Court, shall be in effect for Calendar Year 2006 and thereafter, unless amended or changed through future Order of this Court.
