ORDER

Acting under the authority of Article V, Sections 1 and 5 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, and the inherent power of this Court,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED THAT;

Supreme Court Rule, Part K, Rule XXXVI is hereby enacted to read as follows:

**PART K. RECUSAL OF A JUSTICE OF THE SUPREME COURT OF LOUISIANA, OR OF A JUDGE OF A COURT OF APPEAL, DISTRICT, FAMILY, JUVENILE, PARISH, CITY, TRAFFIC OR MUNICIPAL COURT OF THE STATE OF LOUISIANA.**

**Rule XXXVI.** If a justice of the Supreme Court of Louisiana or a judge of a court of appeal, district, family, juvenile, parish, city, traffic or municipal court of the State of Louisiana recuses himself/herself in a proceeding before that justice's or judge's court, that justice or judge shall, unless otherwise prohibited by law or applicable Supreme Court Rule, provide in writing the factual basis for recusal within fifteen days of the rendering of the order of recusal.

This Order shall become effective September 1, 2002, and shall remain in full force and effect thereafter, until amended through future orders of this Court.
