

LIFT RURAL JUSTICE LEGAL INCUBATOR PROJECT ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS

New Attorneys Interested in Going Solo – Apply to the LIFT Rural Justice Project

This 12-month project is designed to train and support new attorneys in developing solo and small law practices in underserved, *rural communities*. The project helps solo practitioners build public interest-focused practices, while bringing much-needed legal services to low - and moderate-income Louisianans living in rural parts of the state with limited access.

Benefits of the Program: Participating attorneys work with experienced Acadiana Legal Service Corporation (ALSC) lawyers and receive free access to case management software and legal research programs, CLE training, mentorship, and the opportunity to co-counsel on cases with ALSC lawyers. In exchange for the training and incubation of their practice, attorneys agree to provide free legal representation on pro bono cases referred by ALSC, for which they will receive a set flat fee depending upon the case type.

Parishes and Types of Cases: The parishes targeted include Avoyelles, Cameron, Catahoula, Claiborne, Concordia, De Soto, East and West Carroll, Franklin, Grant, LaSalle, Madison, Richland, Sabine, Tensas, Union, and Vernon. The types of cases may include successions, family law, expungements, advanced directives, bankruptcy, social security/disability, Child in Need of Care(CINC), housing and consumer issues.

Who Should Apply: Louisiana licensed attorneys with 0-7 years of practice experience who are dedicated to establishing sustainable law practices that provide legal services to limited-income individuals and small businesses in rural, underserved communities and are excited about using technology and innovation to implement new ways of providing cost-effective legal services are encouraged to apply. Application deadline is December 5, 2025.

Legal Innovators for Tomorrow (LIFT) is a legal incubator program designed to support new lawyers build viable and sustainable public interest-focused law firms that serve unmet civil legal needs. Through a collaborative partnership with Acadiana Legal Service Corporation (ALSC), participating attorneys in this project will provide civil legal services to low- and moderate-income Louisianians living in underserved, <u>rural communities</u>.

This incubator program is for new or transitioning attorneys starting their own solo law firm. During the 12-month program, incubator attorneys receive *free access to case management software* and *legal research programs, training, mentorship*, and *court shadowing opportunities* as they work alongside experienced ALSC legal practitioners. In exchange for the training and incubation of their practice, attorneys agree to provide pro bono representation for which they will receive a set flat fee from ALSC based on the case type. The types of cases may include Successions, Family Law, Expungements, Advance Directives, Bankruptcy, Social Security Disability, Child In Need of Care (CINC), Housing, and Consumer related issues.

Louisiana licensed attorneys with 0-7 years practice experience who plan to develop or have begun to develop a solo or small law practice and are committed to providing legal representation in any of the parishes identified are encouraged to apply.
