Proclamation

WHEREAS,

four out of five Louisianans living in poverty face civil legal challenges without access to an attorney, most often involving domestic violence, divorce, child custody, evictions, or financial exploitation of the elderly; and

WHEREAS,

legal services organizations, pro bono programs, the Louisiana State Bar Association, and local bar associations mobilize volunteer attorneys to provide critical support to those unable to afford counsel; and

WHEREAS,

civil legal aid is a vital safeguard for families and communities, addressing urgent needs related to housing, employment, healthcare, education, and personal safety, and often determining whether a person secures shelter or faces homelessness, achieves financial stability or falls into bankruptcy, or lives in safety rather than in fear; and

WHEREAS,

access to legal assistance can be life-changing, helping individuals protect their families, secure housing, maintain employment, access healthcare, pursue education, and resolve crises that might otherwise threaten their well-being; and

WHEREAS,

the week of October 20–25, 2025, marks the celebration of "Pro Bono Week" in Louisiana, led by the Louisiana State Bar Association's Access to Justice Program in partnership with libraries, pro bono providers, public agencies, private businesses, and community-based organizations to celebrate and strengthen the tradition of service by attorneys who share their time and expertise to advance equal justice.

NOW, THEREFORE,

I, Jeff Landry, Governor of Louisiana, do hereby proclaim

October 20-25, 2025, as

Pro Bono Week

in the State of Louisiana and call this observance to the attention of all citizens.
