Legal assistance for Spanish-speaking callers can be arranged via a callback appointment. The hotline has begun receiving disaster-related calls and the numbers have steadily increased. The Louisiana Civil Justice Center (LCJC) operates the disaster legal assistance hotline and is seeking attorney volunteers to respond to the growing volume of disaster calls and voice messages. Volunteers will be trained on how to use LCJC's case management software and work alongside LCJC attorneys to take disaster calls, give legal information and make referrals. Volunteers can sign up for a two-hour shift, Monday through Friday, 10 a.m.-noon or 1-3 p.m., working from the LCJC office at 601 St. Charles Ave... 3rd floor, New Orleans (in the Louisiana Bar Center).
