

Brandon R. Byrd is a historian of nineteenth and twentiethcentury Black intellectual and social history, with a special focus on Pan-Africanism and Black internationalism. He has published in several prominent academic journals including *The* Journal of African American History as well as GQ, The Washington Post, and other popular newspapers and magazines. Dr. Byrd's book, *The Black Republic: African Americans and* the Fate of Haiti (University of Pennsylvania Press, 2020), recovers a crucial and overlooked chapter of Black internationalism and political thought by exploring the attitudes that U.S. Black intellectuals in the post-U.S. Civil War era held toward Haiti. It received an honorable mention for the Isis Duarte Book Prize from the Latin American Studies Association. Dr. Byrd currently teaches history at Vanderbilt University and he is also the co-editor of the Black Lives and Liberation series published by Vanderbilt University Press.
