

Professor Laila L. Hlass is the Director of Experiential Learning and Co-Director of the Immigrant Rights Clinic. Her teaching and scholarship focus on law, policy and practices that affect access to justice within the immigration law regime for particularly vulnerable communities including children, detainees, asylum-seekers, and survivors of violence, as well as emerging pedagogy and practices in experiential learning. In 2018, Prof. Hlass was awarded a Carol Lavin Bernick Faculty Grant to develop pedagogical films for experiential

faculty, as part of the <u>Legal Interviewing and Language Access Film Project</u>. She regularly speaks and appears in the news regarding migration, refugees and immigrant children and has written op-eds for Slate, the Boston Globe and Times-Picayune.
