

Ed Tarpley is an attorney in Alexandria, Louisiana, who served as District Attorney for the 35th Judicial District, Grant Parish, Louisiana, from 1991 to 1997. Ed graduated from LSU Law School in 1979 and has practiced law in Louisiana for 38 years.

Mr. Tarpley is a member of the Board of Governors for the Louisiana State Bar Association. He serves as Vice-President of the Board of Directors for the Cenla Pregnancy Center in Alexandria, Louisiana and also serves on the Steering Committee for the Louisiana Governor's Prayer Breakfast. He is a member of the Louisiana Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers, the Alexandria Bar Association,

the Alexandria Rotary Club and the Federalist Society. He was a Delegate to the 2016 Republican National Convention.

Mr. Tarpley is a defender of the cause of liberty and a frequent speaker on the Constitution and the Bill of Rights. He is the author of a resolution adopted by the Louisiana State Bar Association on June 9, 2016, calling for the legislature to restore the unanimous criminal jury verdict in Louisiana. He was a leading advocate and spokesman for the successful statewide campaign in 2018 to adopt a constitutional amendment which restored the unanimous criminal jury verdict in Louisiana and repealed a Jim Crow law which dated back to 1880 during the post-Reconstruction era. In 2018, Mr. Tarpley was awarded the Kevin Kane Justice Award by Louisiana Family Forum for his commitment to justice and outstanding leadership in the passage of Senate Bill 243 requiring unanimous juries in Louisiana and was also honored by the Louisiana Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers who awarded him the Chief Justice Pascal F. Calogero, Jr. Lifetime Achievement Award.
