

Judge Desiree Dyess was elected to the 10th Judicial District Court bench in November 2014 and took office on January 1, 2015. She earned her undergraduate degree with honors from Northwestern State University, and her Juris Doctorate from the LSU School of Law. She trained in Mediation for Family Law at Loyola University, and has been a Board Certified Family Law Specialist by the Louisiana Board of Legal Specialization since 2007.

She was a partner at the Dyess Law Firm for 14 years before taking the bench, and was admitted to practice before all Louisiana State and Federal Courts, the U.S. 5th Circuit Court of Appeals, as well as the U.S. Supreme Court.
