SUPREME COURT OF LOUISIANA

ORDER

Acting under the authority of Article V, Section 1 of Constitution of 1974, and the inherent power of this Court, and considering the continuing need to take measures to stop the spread of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19),

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- 1. For mandatory continuing legal education compliance year 2022, the limitation on "self-study" credits (as defined in Rule 3(d) of Supreme Court Rule XXX) shall be increased to six (6) hours annually;
- 2. Rule 5(b) of Supreme Court Rule XXX is hereby modified to permit up to eight (8) excess hours earned in the 2019 compliance year to be carried forward to compliance year 2020, 2021, 2022 or 2023; and
- 3. For mandatory continuing legal education compliance year 2022, the limitation on "self-study" credits (as defined in Rule 3(d) of Supreme Court Rule XXX) shall be increased to a maximum of one-half the total number of credits required to complete the certification requirements for the approved fields of law set forth in the Louisiana State Bar Association Plan of Legal Specialization.
