WRITING CREDIT

Regulation / Rule 3.9 Credit may be earned through authorship of a law review article on matters of law published by an American Bar Association accredited law school, or through authorship of a book on matters of law published by a recognized publishing company. Six (6) hours of CLE credit will be awarded for each article or book published. Any attorney may petition the MCLE Department for credit for authorship of articles on matters of law published in other publications. The article must comply with the provisions of Regulation 4.1(a) and (b).

Articles in Bar Journals shall receive up to four (4) hours credit depending on length and depth of article.

No credit will be given for publishing in Bar Briefs and newsletters or law firm web pages; no credit will be given for editing or book reviews.
