

Speaker

Warren M. Billings, Distinguished Professor of History, Emeritus at the University of New Orleans, is a student of colonial Virginia and Louisiana law. At UNO Dr. Billings was a member and later Chairman of the History Department faculty from 1968 to 2005. He graduated A.B. from the College of William & Mary, A.M. from the University of Pittsburgh, and Ph.D. from Northern Illinois University. Widely published, his books include *The Historic Rules of the Supreme Court of Louisiana, 1813–1879* (Lafayette, La., 1985), *In Search of Fundamental Order: Louisiana's Constitutions, 1813–1974* [ed.] (Lafayette, La., 1993), *A Law Unto Itself?: Essays in the New Louisiana Legal History* [ed.] (Baton Rouge, La., 2001), *The Supreme Court of Louisiana: A Bicentennial Sketch* (New Orleans, 2013), and *An Unexpected Collector: The Making of An Historian's Law Library* (Austin, Texas, 2013). Dr. Billings holds honorary life membership in the British and Irish Association of Law Librarians and the Company of Fellows of the Louisiana Historical Association. The Louisiana Historical Association presented him with its Garnie W. McGinty Lifetime Achievement Award in 2003. By order of the Supreme Court of Louisiana, he was designated Bicentennial Court Historian in March 2013.
