Pursuant to Federal Rule of Appellate Procedure 28(j), the Appellees hereby notify the Court of two recent decisions, one from the United States Supreme Court and one from the United States District Court for the Western District of Texas, which are relevant to this appeal.

The Appellees' brief cites Jarchow v. State Bar of Wisconsin, No. 19-3444 (7th Cir. Dec. 23, 2019), which summarily affirmed the dismissal of claims challenging the constitutionality of Wisconsin's integrated bar. On June 1, 2020, the United States Supreme Court denied the petition for a writ of certiorari in Jarchow. Justice Alito, who authored the majority opinions in Harris v. Quinn, 573 U.S. 616 (2014), and Janus v. AFSCME, 138 S. Ct. 2448 (2018), joined the majority in denying the petition. Only Justice Thomas and Justice Gorsuch dissented from the denial, and their dissenting opinion makes clear that Keller v. State Bar of California, 496 U.S. 1 (1990), requires the dismissal of claims challenging the constitutionality of integrated bar associations.

The Appellees' brief also cites *McDonald*, et al. v. Sorrels, et al., No. 1:19-cv-219 (W.D. Tex.), which involves a challenge to the constitutionality of Texas's integrated bar. ² On May 29, 2020, the District Court granted the defendants' motion for summary judgment and dismissed the plaintiff's claims, concluding that *Keller*, 496 U.S. 1, rather than *Janus*, 138 S. Ct. 2448, applies to First Amendment challenges to integrated bar associations.
