# 2025-26 LSBA **Dues and LADB** Assessment **Payment Cycle to Begin in May**

he purpose of the Louisiana State Bar Association (LSBA) is set forth in Art. III § 1 of its Articles of Incorporation. The expenditure of funds by the LSBA is limited as set forth in the LSBA's Articles and Bylaws; Supreme Court Rule XVIII § 6; Keller v. State Bar of California, 496 U.S. 1 (1990); and McDonald v. Longley, 4 F.4th 229 (5th Cir. 2021).

A member may object to the use of any portion of the member's bar dues for activities he or she considers inconsistent with constitutional standards. Members can object to LSBA expenditures based on the preliminary budget, the audited financial statements, the email alerts, the "Bar Briefs," the Louisiana Bar Journal, or any other notice that they receive. Member objections must be filed within 45 days of the date of the Bar's publication of notice of the activity to which the member

# Payment of Dues and Assessment

LSBA members have the option to pay their 2025-26 LSBA dues and Louisiana Attorney Disciplinary Board (LADB) assessment by ACH electronic check, credit card, or download and mail their Attorney Registration Statement and checks for the payment of fees. Members are encouraged to pay and file electronically, through the LSBA website, which is available during times when the Bar Center is closed or if mail service is disrupted due to inclement weather. Further, electronic payment gives members more control over their information in the database and allows for more timely updates to their member records. The website is unavailable nightly between 10 p.m.-1 a.m. CST.

Filing the Attorney Registration Statement is an important part of an LSBA member's annual requirement and can be completed by mail or electronically. Mailing in the Attorney Registration Statement with two separate payments of Dues and Assessment constitutes filing. When paying online, verifying and/or updating member demographic information serves as electronically filing the Attorney Registration Statement.

Emeritus Status is available for lawyers who only handle pro bono work or uncompensated work for family members (both subject to certain guidelines and restrictions) and who meet age and practice criteria. Lawyers should review the Emeritus Status guidelines and restrictions for possible election. Election of emeritus status MUST be made prior to payment of the Dues and Assessment and the election deadline for the 2025-26 membership year is June 30, 2025. Filing electronically can be a quick and simple process, utilizing the online member accounts that participants have relied on for years to register for CLE seminars and to access Fastcase. If an attorney has not yet set up a member account, one can easily be created at: https://www.lsba.org/

After member data is confirmed but before the payment/filing process begins, members will be advised that they also need to go to *https://www.LADB.org* to complete the Louisiana Supreme Court Trust Account Disclosure and Overdraft Notification Authorization Form and will be asked to confirm that they understand this requirement. The Louisiana Attorney Disciplinary Board is the certifying agency for the Trust filing for LSBA members' IOLTA accounts. Filing is quick and easy at *www.ladb.org* and any issues concerning trust accounts should be directed to LADB at (504)834-1488.

The collection schedule will be the same as in prior years. In lieu of mailing a statement to each member, in mid-May, the LSBA will mail a postcard to each member, which will provide instructions to go online to *https:// www.LSBA.org* to complete the registration process, pay the annual dues and assessment, and go online to *https://www.LADB.org* to complete the Trust Account Form. *This is the only mailing members will receive prior to the July 1, 2025, due date; attorney registration statements will NOT be mailed.* 

Throughout the dues collection period, the LSBA will email reminders using the email address, compliance@lsbamembership.com. Members are encouraged to add this email address to their contact list to avoid missing important communications. Members should not reply to this email address, but rather

Once members have electronically filed their Attorney Registration Statements (including any necessary changes and/or updates) and made the required payments, they will receive email confirmations. The filing and payment deadline will remain July 1, 2025. The LSBA will continue to mail delinquency and ineligibility notices to those who fail to meet the deadlines.

Members who elect to pay by electronic check will continue to pay the following fees:

► LSBA dues (practicing more than three years): \$200;

► LSBA dues (Emeritus Status): \$100; and

► LSBA dues (practicing three years or less): \$80:

► LADB assessment (practicing more than three years): \$235;

► LADB assessment (Emeritus Status): \$117.50; and

► LADB assessment (practicing three years or less): \$170.

Those who are planning to pay by electronic check should contact their financial institutions to confirm that their

#### accounts allow payment by this method. If your account is Positive Pay Protected, update the Company ID 1016207445.

As was the case last year, processing fees of 3%, plus a .20 transaction fee, will be assessed if choosing to pay by credit card. Total amounts, including assessed fees, are as follows:

► LSBA dues (practicing more than three years): \$206.20;

► LSBA dues (Emeritus Status): \$103.20: and

► LSBA dues (practicing three years or less): \$82.60;

► LADB assessment (practicing more than three years): \$242.25;

► LADB assessment (Emeritus Status): \$121.23; and

► LADB assessment (practicing three years or less): \$175.30.

### ABA House of Delegates Meeting

At its 2025 Midyear Meeting, the American Bar Association's House of Delegates (HOD) approved more than two dozen policy resolutions focused on judicial security, ethics, and lawyer wellbeing.

Key measures included a resolution supporting a binding ethics code for the U.S. Supreme Court and policies aimed at protecting judges' personal information and enhancing court security. The HOD also recommended changes to federal case assignment procedures to promote fairness.

Other resolutions addressed legal education, bar admission standards, and workplace policies supporting lawyer well-being. The HOD also discussed the impact of recent executive actions on legal fellowships and diversity initiatives.

Arizona Gov. Katie Hobbs and ABA President Bill Bay delivered remarks during the meeting. The next HOD session is scheduled for August in Toronto.

# LSBA Modest Means Directory and Resources for Attorneys Offering Affordable Legal Options

ince the launch of the online Modest Means Directory in 2018, the Louisiana State Bar Association (LSBA) has received more than 25,000 inquiries to find affordable legal service solutions. While legal aid and pro bono organizations offer free legal services to families living at or below the 200% federal poverty line, many individuals who earn above that cannot afford legal services at the going rate and, therefore, need affordable legal service options.

The United Way's new ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) Report emphasizes that much of the population in Louisiana above the federal poverty level still do not earn enough income to meet a basic survival budget.

Many ALICE and modest means families are turning to the Directory to find affordable legal options from the 70 attorneys listed who provide services throughout the state. But due to the high demand, more attorneys are necessary to meet the needs of the approximately 500 to 700 individuals per month seeking legal services via the Directory.

Many attorneys already offer costeffective legal services. For attorneys interested in joining the Directory, the LSBA offers a host of tools and resources for support, including free CLE programs on LSR/unbundling legal services and substantive law training; Practice Aid Guides; and Online Member Profile Cards.

In addition to the resources, the Directory presents an opportunity for new attorneys, specifically new solos, to grow their client base by increasing access to cost effective services for the many people and families in Louisiana in need of affordable legal options.

# **Committee Preferences:** Get Involved in Your Bar!

Committee assignment requests are now being accepted for the 2025-26 Bar year. Louisiana State Bar Association (LSBA) President-Elect Edward J. Walters, Jr. will make all committee appointments. Widespread participation is encouraged in all Bar programs and activities. Appointments to committees are not guaranteed, but every effort will be made to accommodate members' interests. When making selections, members should consider the time commitment associated with committee assignments and their availability to participate. Also, members are asked to list experience relevant to service on the chosen committees. The deadline for committee assignment requests is Wednesday, April 9. The current committees are listed below.

#### Access to Justice Committee

The committee works to ensure that every Louisiana citizen has access to competent civil legal representation by promoting and supporting a broad-based and effective justice community through collaboration between the Louisiana State Bar Association, the Louisiana Bar Foundation, Louisiana law schools, private practitioners, local bar associations, pro bono programs and legal aid providers.

#### **Bar Governance Committee**

The committee ensures effective and equitable governance of the association by conducting an ongoing evaluation of relevant procedures and making recommendations to the House of Delegates regarding warranted amendments to the association's Articles of Incorporation and/or Bylaws.

#### Children's Law Committee

The committee provides a forum for attorneys and judges working with children to promote improvements and changes in the legal system to benefit children, parents and the professionals who serve these families.

#### Client Assistance Fund Committee

The committee protects the public and maintains the integrity of the legal profession by reimbursing, to the extent deemed appropriate, losses caused by the dishonest conduct of any licensed Louisiana lawyer practicing in the state.

#### Continuing Legal Education Program Committee

The committee fulfills the Louisiana Supreme Court mandate of making quality and diverse continuing legal education opportunities available at an affordable price to LSBA members.

#### **Criminal Justice Committee**

The committee recognizes and addresses issues affecting the Louisiana criminal justice system, provides a forum for discussion, and works with stakeholders to develop programs and solutions for fair and effective administration of justice.

#### **Diversity Committee**

The committee assesses the level of racial, ethnic, national origin, religion, gender, age, sexual orientation and disability diversity within all components of the legal profession in Louisiana, identifies barriers to the attainment of full and meaningful representation and participation in the legal profession by persons of diverse backgrounds, and proposes programs and methods to effectively remove barriers and achieve greater diversity.

#### Ethics Advisory Service Committee

The committee encourages ethical lawyer conduct by supporting the LSBA's Ethics Counsel in his/her provision of informal, non-binding ethics opinions to members of the Bar.

#### **Insurance Committee**

The committee ensures the long-term stability of all Bar-endorsed insurance plans, balancing the most favorable rates, coverage and service for Louisiana lawyers by overseeing the relationship between the Louisiana State Bar Association, its carrier and its third-party administrator. The committee is charged with management of the professional liability, life, disability and other group plans offered to members of the Louisiana State Bar Association. The committee is comprised of a chair and up to 18 additional members.

# Legal Services for Persons with Disabilities Committee

The committee provides members of the bench, Bar and general public with a greater understanding of the legal needs and rights of persons with disabilities, and helps persons with disabilities meet their legal needs and understand their rights and resources.

#### Medical/Legal Interprofessional Committee

The committee works with the joint committee of the Louisiana State Medical Society to promote collegiality between members of the legal and medical professions by receiving and making recommendations on complaints relative to physician/lawyer relationships and/or problems.

#### **Outreach Committee**

The committee develops and implements sustained outreach to local and specialty bars throughout the state and increases awareness of the member services and benefits provided by the LSBA. The committee encourages member participation in all aspects of the LSBA and facilitates participation through the use of technology and other feasible alternatives.

# Practice Assistance and Improvement Committee

The committee serves the Bar and the public in furtherance of the association's goals of prevention and correction of lawyer misconduct and assistance to victims of lawyer misconduct by evaluating, developing and providing effective alternatives to discipline programs for minor offenses, educational and practice assistance programs, and programs to resolve minor complaints and lawyer/client disputes. The committee encourages lawyers to exercise the highest standards of integrity, ethics and professionalism in their conduct; examines systemic issues in the legal system arising out of the lawyer's relationship and duties to his/her clients, other lawyers, the courts, the judicial system and the public good; provides the impetus and means to positively impact those relationships and duties; improves access to the legal system; and improves the quality of life and work/life balance for lawyers.

#### Rules of Professional Conduct Committee

The committee monitors and evaluates developments in legal ethics and, when appropriate, recommends changes to the Louisiana Rules of Professional Conduct; acts as liaison to the Louisiana Supreme Court on matters concerning the Rules of Professional Conduct; reviews issues of legal ethics and makes recommendations to the LSBA House of Delegates regarding modifications to the existing ethical rules; oversees the work of the Ethics Advisory Service and its Advertising Committee, Publications Subcommittee and other subcommittees; and promotes the highest professional standards of ethics in the practice of law.

#### Transitioning Lawyers Committee

The committee safeguards the public by educating members of the legal profession about age-related disabilities. The committee also helps attorneys suffering from impairments that prevent them from practicing law competently to transition out of the practice of law with dignity.

# Unauthorized Practice of Law Committee

The committee protects the public from incompetent or fraudulent activities by those who are unauthorized to practice law or who are otherwise misleading those in need of legal services.

# 2025 LSBA Criminal Justice Summit Examines Current Issues and Collaborative Solutions

n Friday, Feb. 7, the Louisiana State Bar Association (LSBA) Criminal Justice Committee hosted its 10th Criminal Justice Summit, titled "Justice in Focus: Current Issues, Collaborative Solutions." The inaugural summit was held in 2010 to address challenges within Louisiana's criminal justice system, and since then, the committee has consistently organized summits that serve as a forum for discussion and learning.

The LSBA Criminal Justice Summit was a gathering of minds, with attendees representing a broad spectrum of stakeholders within the criminal legal system. The diverse group included district attorneys, public defenders, judges, and law enforcement, as well as representatives from city, district, and appellate courts, nonprofit organizations, law schools, state agencies, private firms, the Louisiana Supreme Court, and community organizations. This event was a melting pot of perspectives, bringing people together to learn, discuss, and work toward change.

This year, the Summit examined current issues across various criminal justice topics, featuring five presentations and panels on critical legal issues impacting the criminal justice system. The topics included legislative updates from the 2024 sessions, forensic toxicology, medical marijuana, the Integrated Criminal Justice Information System (ICJIS), current challenges in juvenile justice, mental health diversion programs, and specialty courts.
